### Special dates / public holidays

- Sun. 1<sup>st</sup> *Toussaint* (All Saint's Day) - a festival honouring the saints of the Roman Catholic church. It precedes the *Fête des Morts* on the 2<sup>nd</sup> when people honour the dead and bring flowers, usually chrysanthemums and heather, to the graves of relations (see also page 2)
- Wed. 11<sup>th</sup> *l'Armistice* (Remembrance Day): the 97<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the end of World War I. Now this is the day when those killed in both WWI and WW2 are remembered. Services take place across France, one of the most well known being the memorial ceremony at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier in Paris

## Eating out

Opened in 2010 by David and Victoria Powell, *Le Papillon* on 23 Grande Rue, Landivy (53) is still a popular and busy restaurant. ### *Toussaint* - All Saint’s Day

November 1<sup>st</sup>: *Toussaint* (All Saints) is a public holiday in France. It is the eve of *le Jour des Morts* (All Souls) and the time when the dead are remembered. Village church bells used to toll all night while people held a wake and said prayers. They sustained themselves seasonally with freshly picked chestnuts and the first of the harvest’s new wines. Customs and superstitions varied from region to region but there was a widely held belief that for each chestnut you roasted and ate on November 1<sup>st</sup> a soul was saved from purgatory

On Sun. 8<sup>th</sup> from 10h to 18h in the Hall des Expositions, rue Volney, Mayenne (53): British and French amateur & artisanal craftspeople will display and sell their wares (80 stallholders). This year’s theme is ‘the Wild West’ and vendors & volunteers dress up and join in the spirit of the event, and there will be 5 performances by the “Cante Navajo’s Country” dancing group. ## Something for all the family

*Refuge de l'Arche* (the Sanctuary of the Ark), route du Menil Saint-fort, Chateau Gontier (53) is always worth a visit. They receive injured or sick wildlife which, after medical treatment, are released into their natural habitat (only animals too dependent upon humans are kept), also unwanted animals or exotic pets. 14 hectares accommodate around 1,500 animals (including lions, tigers, bears, wolves, monkeys and leopards) in parks, aviaries and shelters, with good observation areas for undisturbed views for photographers; there is also a reptile house. Refreshments are available on site. Entry: adults 10€; 4-11s: 6,50€, under 4s free; disabled: 5,50€. ### A new knitting shop has opened in Ernée (53)

### Cheese of the Month : *Bons Mayennais*

The *fromagerie* in Martigné-sur-Mayenne (53) celebrates 103 years of trading. Due to its proximity to running water, the Château de Bois-Belleray became a dairy in 1912. In 1933 it was bought by a M. Vaubernier and the *fromagerie* took on the name of the owner. Today with a turnover of over €40million, it employs a workforce of 110. Using milk from 286 farms within a radius of 50km, they produce 2,000 tons of butter and 6,000 tons of cheese a year, including a *camembert* (with low-salt and bio versions) a *brie* and a soft cheese.

### *Marché au Musée* in Jublains (53)

On Sun. 1<sup>st</sup> from 9h30 to 17h30 in the *Musée Archéologique départemental* at 13 rue de la Liberation in Jublains, you will find original contemporary creations by professionals from the art world but also reproductions of, and items inspired by, antique objects – in particular, marble in the temporary exhibition '*corps et âmes*'. 12 artists, creators and artisans, with textiles, paintings, jewellery, etc., are present to show you their techniques. Some great Christmas ideas. Free entry.

### Something you didn't know you didn't know . . . .

Where does the English word 'farce' come from? When it came into use in the 1500s it meant 'forcemeat' or stuffing, the meaning still being used in France today (*farci*) and comes from the Roman verb "*facire*: to stuff". But the French word also meant the words of explanation interspersed between long Latin chants in church. The idea was that these interludes were 'stuffed in' and this use of "farce" soon extended to the impromptu buffoonery inserted by actors into religious plays: they became so popular that 'farce' took on a life of its own!

### A church bell in Parné-sur-Roc (53) to be refurbished

In October, one of the 3 church bells, known as '*Marie-France*' and weighing 880kg, was lowered from the belfry to be taken away to the workshops in Trémentines (49). This had become urgent due to degradation of certain parts of the bell. On 11<sup>th</sup> November 'Marie France' will be re-instated alongside her 2 sister bells, which have already been repaired, and where they will continue to ring the hours daily as the bells have done since 1760.

## Lest We Forget

In September, Thérèse Pellerin (age 81) and Louis Padeloup (89) met American Bruce Brittain, who was visiting the site where his uncle, Gerald Gillies, died at his post as gunner in the tail of his B-17 bomber, along with 8 other members of the crew. On 8<sup>th</sup> August 1944 they had witnessed the B-17 “**Chow Hound**” take a direct hit from a German DCA and the plane crashed near the property “L’Errerie” near Lonlay l’Abbaye (61). 6 bodies were retrieved and buried nearby temporarily before being moved to the US military cemeteries of St-Laurent-sur-Mer (Calvados) and Saint-James (Manche), where they remain today. The other 3 bodies were not found in the wreckage, but 50 years later a specialist team with a metal detector found their bones and parts of the plane, notably the remains of the tail, and these were repatriated to the USA. DNA tests identified Gerald Gillies as one of them and they are now buried in Arlington National Cemetery in Washington. Parts of their equipment and some ammunition had also been found and were given to Bruce Brittain in a moving ceremony attended by the president of *l’Association du Souvenir Aérien*.

### Have your chimney swept to avoid soot and killer gas

A reminder as winter approaches that it is necessary for your woodstoves, open fires and heating boilers to be made ready for winter. Getting your chimney cleaned is not just a good way to get your fire to burn more efficiently and safely, it is also a legal requirement. Not getting the chimney swept is a Category 3 offence that could lead to a 450€ fine - but the consequences could be much more severe in the case of a house fire, which can be caused by a build-up of soot and tar or a birds nest, but also by not maintaining the chimney or incorrectly installed flue liners. To be covered for insurance purposes you must have a chimney safety certificate (*certificat de ramonage*) from a registered and insured chimney sweep.
