#### Some local customs – Saint Nicholas

On the night of Dec. 5th, the eve of the feast of St Nicholas, young children in the NE and N of France are unusually well-behaved. Before going to bed they put their shoes and some straw in front of the chimney for their patron saint and for the donkey he always rides on his travels. St Nicholas traditionally leaves behind spiced biscuits shaped in his own image.

#### Restoration of one of the churches in Domfront (61)

Restoration work on Notre-Dame-de-l'Eau, in the Quartier de la Gare (lower Domfront) should begin in 2017 until 2020. On his death in 2007, le Vicomte Couppel de Lude had bequeathed the sum of 450,000€ to be used for the repair of this church. The work (roofing, gutters, lighting, walls, stairs to the bell-tower and also the surrounding gardens for easier access) will be controlled by an architect from the *Monuments Historique*. [As a reminder, in 1168 Thomas à Becket preached in this church - two years before his untimely death].

#### Fête de Noël in Ceaucé (61)

On Sat. 19<sup>th</sup> this popular Christmas Fête is open from 14h to 21h. There is a covered market selling artisanal items plus food & drink. *Père Noël* rides into town at 19h (-ish) which is fun for the children. Also you can enjoy the wonderful Christmas lights and diorama.

#### The Lions Club and 'Les tulipes contre le cancer'

For the 21<sup>st</sup> year, a dozen volunteers from the *Lions Club Conde-Tinchebray* have planted 20,000 tulip bulbs in land near Tinchebray (61) and 35,000 bulbs in land bordering the road in Montilly-sur-Noireau (61) – in 2 separate areas in case one area is destroyed by hail, flooding, etc. Tulips need to be planted in different terrain each year, so new land is always needed – but the maize grows well after tulips! They used to use a bulb-planting machine (which planted several bulbs at the same time) but now, to save costs, they borrow an old potato planter - which takes longer as it only plants one bulb at a time! The tulips will eventually be on sale in April, with the proceeds going towards the fight against cancer.

# Saint Fraimbault (61) – 'le village fleuri' – keeps its 4<sup>th</sup> 'flower'

This village of 568 inhabitants has again been awarded its '4 *fleur*' rating (seen on the village sign) for the 3<sup>rd</sup> year running. Participating villages/towns are judged each year and this prestigious award (1, 2, or 3 *fleurs*) is given on the basis of not only the floral excellence, but also for the ecological efforts in operation and the activities organised to promote this 'patrimoine fleural'. Being awarded 4 *fleurs* is a rare and special achievement.

# *l'Abbaye de Clermont* near Olivet (53)

This ancient Cistercian abbey, 4kms from Olivet, was founded by Bernard de Clairvaux (later Saint Bernard) in 1152 in a unique area of woods and lakes. Today many parts of the original buildings still stand and are *Monuments Historiques* − the abbey church of impressive dimensions and the refectory of the brothers with its beautiful vaulted ceilings supported by granite columns. Volunteers of '*les Amis du Clermont*' welcome visitors whose support helps with the upkeep and restoration of the site. Several events take place there during the year − concerts, exhibitions, etc. Open all year from 9h until nightfall. Entry: 4€. www.abbaye-declairmont.com

#### Lest we forget – *les villages morts pour la France*

Remembered on Armistice Day – six French villages which were reduced to rubble during WWI and never rebuilt, and are today called "*les villages morts pour la France*". These villages - Beaumont-en-Verdunois, Bezonvaux, Cumières-le-Mort-Homme, Fleury-devant-Douaumont, Haumont-près-Samogneux & Louvemont-Côte-du-Poivre – are all in Meuse *département* (55) and were destroyed during the Battle of Verdun which raged from Feb. 21<sup>st</sup> to Dec. 18<sup>th</sup> 1916, costing the lives of around 70,000 soldiers each month.

Local inhabitants were evacuated at the beginning of the battle, but when they returned nothing was left standing. There were no trees, hedges, gardens, fields – nothing. The churches, barns and houses had completely disappeared and the land was so churned into mounds and foxholes it was impossible to know where the buildings and streets had been. There was nothing but heavily polluted mud in all directions and under it lay so much unexploded ordnance that rebuilding was impossible. In 1919, the government bought the land and decided that the 6 villages should become monuments to the sacrifices made during the *Grand Guerre*. Each would have a war memorial with a small chapel built on or near the ruins of its church and would be designated as "*mort pour la France*". Today, the site of each village is covered with grass and trees, and each has a budget of around €22,000 in order to maintain signposts and memorials, cut the lawns, etc.

These were not the only villages destroyed in the First World War and countless others disappeared in the same way. Some were rebuilt in different locations but many were simply abandoned and the land annexed by neighbouring communes. Those forgotten, disappeared villages and communes have even officially lost their names.

# Something for all the family – *La Bourbansais* zoo

In this zoo at Pleugeuneuc (35, between St Malo and Rennes) you will find over 350 animals from 5 continents – including 'Hector' the anteater, lemurs, giraffe, monkeys, llamas, lynx, zebra, flamingos, exotic birds, etc. Open daily all year: end-Sept to end-March: 13h30-17h30 (in school hols 10h30-17h30); April to end-Sept: 10h-19h. www.labourbansais.com

#### Cheese of the Month: Le Brillat Savarin

This is a soft white-crusted cow's milk cheese whose history dates back to 1890, when it was known as *Excelsior* or *Délice des Gourmets* and made by the Dubuc family near Forges-les-Eaux (76). Cheese-maker Henri Androuet re-named it in the 1930s as homage to 18<sup>th</sup> century French gourmet and political figure Jean Anthelme Brillat-Savarin and the name has stuck. It is produced all year round and comes in 12-13cm wheels.

#### A new *boulangerie* opens in Montenay (53)

Au Fournil d'Etienne, at 4 rue des Ormeaux in Montenay, is now owned by Etienne Girault, who already runs a boulangerie in Chailland (53). Open 6 days a week (not Weds.): Mon. to Sat. 7h-13h30 & 15h-19h30 and Suns. 7h-12h30, he offers a selection of breads, from traditional to speciality such as *Tradi-Graine*, *l'Epeautre* (spelt), *la Craquante* (with malted flour), *le Pavé d'Arthur* (rye, barley, sunflower seeds, linseed & buckwheat) - and, of course, their yummy patisseries.

# Traditional Christmas lamp-lit walk around Laval (53)

#### Elliott's Boucherie in Gorron (53) – moving premises

In December, 'Elliotts Boucherie' will be moving a short distance in Gorron - to the road behind the *Infirmiere*, almost opposite the *Café Gourmand*. More than 300,000 carrier pigeons were used during WWI to carry messages for the army. In 1919, a French carrier pigeon called *Vaillant* flew from the Fort de Vaux, near Verdun, to carry a request for help. He was the regiment's last pigeon and therefore the last hope for the soldiers - his mission was successful and after the war he was awarded a medal.
