Eating out

Highly recommended: 'Le Capri' Italian restaurant, 9 route de Saint-James in Fougères (35, see *www.alfio.fr* for location) has smart décor, excellent service and a great menu with a good selection of antipasta, salads, pizzas, meat & fish, and desserts. Very popular, so reservation advised (02 99 94 22 10). Open daily (but not Sundays) 12h-15h & 19h-22h.

Fête du Muguet (Lily of the Valley)

On 1st May it is traditional to offer friends and family *le muguet* to bring luck and joy. This tradition was started in 1561 by King Charles IX - but some say only the sprigs which have 13 flowers bring luck! May 1st is the only day when people are allowed to sell *le muguet* in the streets without having the authority to operate as a business

Les Jardins des Renaudies

Between Easter and 1st Nov in these pretty gardens near Colombiers-du-Plessis (53) you can discover over 3,000 varieties of plants, trees & bushes. Entry: $5 \notin (2 \notin \text{for people living in the 53 region})$. For opening days and times: *www.jardinsdesrenaudies.fr.* 3 events this month:

Exhibition of sculptures by Louis Derbré

Until 30th October at the foot of the Château in Fougères (35): to celebrate the 90th anniversary of the birth of celebrated sculptor Louis Derbré (many of whose works are outside in *l'Espace Les Touches* in Ernée), here are many reproduced sculptures. 4 denote Tolerance, the Future, Courage, Hope, and 6 of 'Mémorial de la Paix' which had been made for the 50th commemoration of the nuclear bombing of Hiroshima - the originals were installed in the park-cemetery near Hiroshima. Un châtaignier pour 13 bébés

Each year since 1998 it has been a tradition in St Bomer-les-Forges (61, north of Domfront) to celebrate the number of babies born each year by planting a chestnut tree in the Bois des Bébés. In 2015, 13 babies were born and in March, armed with spades, the new parents gathered to plant the tree and also erect a metal structure representing a tree with 13 leaves, on which the names of the children and their birth dates are inscribed.

Fête du Village with plant exchange in Lesbois (53)

On Sun. 8th in the *Fête du Village* will be cycle races and the sale of plants, decorative trees and flowers, also *l'Association Bonzai* with initiation into the art of bush trimming. The association Art'Bo opens its doors to show their artists' work. Open to all. Entertainment in the streets during the day.

Cheese of the Month : Carré Mirabelle

This square-shaped artisanal cheese is slightly spicy and has fruity aromas – this is because it is dipped 5 times in plum brandy as it ripens! It has a similar texture to Brie, and it is made at the Abbaye de Vergaville, a Benedictine Abbey in the Lorraine which dates back to the 10^{th} century and where they have been making this cheese since 1938. It is made from raw cow's milk and goes well with a dark beer.

Parachutisme ascensionnel (para-gliding)

On Fri. 20th from 9h to 10h30 at the *Centre Ecole de Parachutisme* at the *Aerodrome de Laval* (53) there is a 'discovery day' with flights for beginners to heights of between 10m and 40m. More info at *www.parachutismelaval.fr*. (A current medical health certificate is needed for this activity)

'Open Day' at the Toiles de Mayenne in Fontaine-Daniel (53)

On Thurs. 19th you can visit this harmonious village, 4km from Mayenne, which was born from the textile industry, and see the workers' cottages, their streets and gardens. Town of the month – Saint-Céneri-le-Gérei (61)

This is a small village with just 120 inhabitants. In the 7th century an Italian hermit, Céneri (Serenicus) lived here and on his death his disciples built a monastery, which was destroyed in 903 by the Vikings. In 1044, Guillaume Giroie settled in the village and built a château, which was besieged (but not taken) by Guillaume le Conquérant (William the Conqueror) in 1060. The village is classed one of *'les plus beaux villages de France'* and since the 19th century has been an inspiration to artists from all over the world.

Rencontre des Peintres: This year on 14th, 15th & 16th, from 10h to 19h, *l'Association des Amis de Saint-Céneri* is holding its 30th *Rencontres des Peintres*. The village opens its doors to around 40 artists from all areas and they produce a real open-air art gallery, attracting each year more than 12,000 visitors. You can stroll from street to street and also meet the artists, have a picnic, see the different art workshops. A lovely setting for a wonderful event.

Laugh and the world gets healthier

Laughing Yoga, the worldwide wellness craze, has spread across France with thousands enjoying the fact that laughing is good for you – and a forced laugh even better as other soon join in and laugh for real. Laughing sessions are planned at many of the 120 clubs across France (*www.clubderire.com*). Dr. Madan Kataria, an Indian GP, popularised it in 2002, saying "you don't laugh because you're happy, you're happy because you laugh". Benefits are said to include improvements to mood, cardiovascular health and fighting against long-term depression.

Special stamps on sale in Normandie post offices.

To help promote the cultural, economic and tourism projects in the Normandie area, *la Poste* have re-issued a *carnet* (booklet) of 12 postage stamps showing paintings of impressionist artists of the end 19th / beginning 20th century, including Fauvism by Gaughin, Cubism by Cézanne and Expressionism by Van Gogh.

Musée de Cidre in Melleray-du-Maine (53)

This family business welcomes the public with a guided tour to discover the history of cider and calvados, including a short film and tasting of their specialities, including apple and pear juice, Pommeau and Calvados. Open from April to Sept., Mon. to Sat., 14h to 19h (in July & Aug., daily 10h to 19h. Entry 4,70€, children 3€.

Something you didn't know you didn't know . . .

Maypoles are also a French tradition! Often the centrepiece of a British village fête, the ribbon-weaving patterns used in UK maypole dancing may have their origins in France where a maypole tradition is still continued in several departments today. The *arbre de mai* or *mât de mai* is a French custom going back centuries and dates further back in European pagan and Celtic fertility rituals for Beltane and the start of summer. In France it involves a tree being brought into the village, erected outside the *mairie* and decorated in ribbons or flags in the *maire*'s honour. Like other European countries, Britain had its own maypoles and dancing but they were banned under Cromwell and not restarted until the Restoration. In France, pictures show maypole dancers with ribbons performing at the court of Louis XIV and when the Revolution ended many religious traditions, maypole dancing (as pagan and thus previously suppressed by the church and the royal court) saw a revival.

Memorial Day at an American cemetery

On Sun. 29th is the Memorial Ceremony at the *Cimetière Americaine* at Montjoie Saint-Martin (50).

'Bar de la Plage' at the Base de Loisirs in La Ferté-Macé (61)

After being closed for 6 months, this bar-restaurant by the *plan d'eau* is back in business and run by Emilia Lubanska, who until 2 years ago worked in the '*Toque Blanche'* restaurant in Bagnoles de l'Orne. At this re-designed bar/restaurant will be snacks (sandwiches, burgers, *croque-monsieur*), salads, steaks, crêpes and ice creams. Open daily, 9h-20h.

A reminder that this 28-ha. lake has a stretch of sandy beach and a safe swimming area, and you can enjoy pedalos, sailing, wind-surfing and canoeing.
