Sat. 16<sup>th</sup> & Sun. 17<sup>th</sup> - 'Journées du Patrimoine de Pays' (heritage days) with a workshop on making savons et bougies (soaps and candles) at 14h and 16h30.

Sun. 24<sup>th</sup> - '*Peintres aux Jardins*' (artists in the gardens): artists set up their easels around the gardens and from 10h to 18h you can watch them as they paint. Judging from 17h.

#### French Inventors: Louis Braille

Louis Braille (1809 - 1852) invented a coded system of raised dots that is used by the blind to read. He was blinded as a child and invented his amazing system in his early teens, and it is still used around the world today. Louis Braille is buried in the Panthéon in Paris as a French national hero.

### Artists in the Streets – in Lassay-les-Châteaux (53)

Sun. 3<sup>rd</sup> will be a day for creation and passion, with artists painting in the streets around the town and in the gardens, producing their masterpieces throughout the day.

### Concours photo (photo competition) in Domfront (61)

### Electric bikes to rent in Domfront (61)

From  $15^{th}$  May, an experimental service will be available until  $15^{th}$  November. The *Conseil Municipal* have invested 21,000€ for the provision of 20 electric bikes and associated equipment. They will be available in 4 sites in the town, including outside the Tourist Office (place de la Roirie). The bikes can be hired to explore the medieval city of Domfront and surrounding area within 15 kms (30 km return). With a returnable deposit of 150€ (to cover damage or theft), the charges are: free for the first 10 minutes, then 1€ for the first hour and 2€ for each following hour. #### Salon du Modélisme in Fougerolles du Plessis (53)

 $\square$  This is the time of year when almost all villages/towns celebrate music with an evening when groups, choirs and solo musicians play in the towns from around 18h30 until . . . well, until they run of our breath, really! For most towns it will be either the Sat.  $16^{th}$  or  $23^{rd}$  but it may be on other days. Ask at your local Tourist Office for the date for your town.

### Something you didn't know you didn't know . . . about local cows

The present cattle Herd Book in France was started in 1883. The *Normande* breed has its origin in cattle that were brought to Normandy by the Viking conquerors in the 9<sup>th</sup> & 10<sup>th</sup> centuries. It is known by its 3 colour markings: white, cream and dark brown; the head is white with black or brown patches around the eyes - the lack of these patches bar a beast from entry in the Herd Book. Though the breed was decimated by the invasion of Normandy during WW2, there are currently 3 million *Normandes* in France, their main role being to provide rich milk for the cheese industry

*Normandes* have been exported world-wide but have received their greatest acceptance in South America where they were introduced in the 1890s. They are a highly adaptable & hardy breed and have done well in beef operations in the Andes Mountains at elevations up to 13,000 ft. The *Normande* cow with her sound feet and legs can travel great distances over rough terrain to economically convert native roughage.

### Monthly *brocantes* in Le Teilleul (50) and Gorron (53)

On one weekend per month, G D Arielle open their *brocantes* at 2 local venues. The owner, Pascal Martin, organises house clearances and there are always different items each time:-

Sat. 2<sup>nd</sup> & Sun. 3<sup>rd</sup> in the large warehouse at Le Teilleul (on *route de Domfront*: on the bend in the road on leaving the town in the Domfront direction). 9h to 18h, non-stop.

Sat. 9<sup>th</sup> & Sun. 10<sup>th</sup> in the old *Meubles du Menhir* warehouse on rue des Frères Lumières, Gorron. 9h to 18h. For more info phone 02 33 51 62 10 (some English spoken).

### Remembrance ceremony

On Sun. 10<sup>th</sup> at 17h, the *Comité La Ferté-Macé du Souvenir Français* invite the population to commemorate the 74th anniversary of when the plane flown by American pilot Conrad Netting was shot down over the commune of Saint-Michel-des-Andaines (61). The ceremony will be at the *stèle* (monument) at the cemetery of Saint-Michel, to honour the memory of this young Texan who died fighting for our freedom on 10<sup>th</sup> June 1944.

### Fête: 'La Belle Epoque' in Bagnoles de l'Orne (61)

This takes place on Sun. 24<sup>th</sup> from 11h to 18h at the *Jardins du Lac* (gardens by the lake). At 11h will be the presentation of 19<sup>th</sup> century costumes, the parade at 12h, and you could then maybe enjoy a picnic lunch on the grass (food and drink also available on site). There will be buggy rides, artists in the streets and musical entertainment. The closing parade will be at 17h30. Free. More info from the Tourist Office (www.bagnolesdelorne.com)

### Discovery of ancient trades

On Thurs. 7<sup>th</sup>, 14h to 17h in *la Maison du Sabotier* (the Clog-maker's House), le Bourg, Tinchebray (61) you can visit the *Forge du Cloutier* and learn about the old way of making *les clous* (nails) and hear the story of *les cloutiers* of St Cornier-des-Landes (61). There is an exhibition of different machines & tools, and an interesting 20 minute film (in French) showing the history of the *sabotiers* (wooden clog makers) and their work methods. Free. ### *Fromage frais* or *fromage blanc* ...?

Fromage frais (lit. "fresh cheese") differs from fromage blanc in that, according to French legislation, fromage frais must contain live cultures when sold, whereas with fromage blanc fermentation has been halted. It has the consistency of cream cheese, but less fat. Yoghurts and fromage frais are both made using cultures - however, certain types of bacteria go into yoghurt and others into cheese cultures. Fromage frais is made using a cheese culture rather than a yoghurt one, which gives it that slightly different flavour. Fromage blanc is prepared in much the same way as crème fraiche, but is made with milk instead of cream for a lower fat food. It is also more tart in flavour than crème fraiche and can be softer in texture so it can be used as a topping for soups and fruits and in other similar ways.

### Saturday 'Promenade cruises' on the boat le Vallis Guidonais

On Sat. 2<sup>nd</sup> June, and every Saturday from 16h30 to 18h, you can sail along the river Mayenne, departing from the *Halte Fluvial*, 100 rue du Vieux Saint Louis in Laval (53). Tickets are 7€ - reservation advised 48h in advance, as a min. of 20 people is required (and good weather!) See other cruises also available at the Laval Tourist Office.

#### Journée: la vie du Château (a day in the life of a Château)

On Sun. 3<sup>rd</sup> this day helps you discover the art of living in the Château of Carrouges (61) through the years. During the day there are also games in the gardens and entertainment of the period. Free. More info at *www.ornetourisme.com* 

#### Le Studio de Réalité Virtuelle (the Virtual Reality Studio)

At 5, rue du Clos Vert, on the SE edge of Saint-Malo (35), you can discover new experiences and immerse yourselves in a virtual world - with helmets, not on a screen. English is spoken. Open all year. From 15€

### Exhibition: Léo Lelée: imagier de l'Art Nouveau

From 2<sup>nd</sup> June to 1st July, at the *Musée Ecole de la Perrine*, 10 Allée Adrien Bruneau, Laval (53). Léopold (known as Léo) Lelée (1872 – 1947) was a famous artist and also poster & postcard illustrator and you can see examples of his work. Free. *www.musee.laval.fr* 

#### Something for all the family : *Enigmaparc*

This *parc de loisirs* (leisure park) at ZA du Bois de Teillay, Janzé (35, west of Fougères) is open all year on weekends, fête days and school holidays. Unique in Europe, *Enigmaparc* is under cover – a world with a pinch of culture, adventure, humour – a day full of experiences. There is a bar, restaurant, games area and young children's area. #### Jardins ouverts / Open Gardens

Open Gardens/*Jardins Ouverts* is a registered association that was founded in 2013 to raise funds for worthy causes in France through the generosity of owners who open their gardens to the public. Admission to these gardens is by annual membership card (10€) which entitles the owner to visit any of the gardens throughout the year on their stated Open Days.

On the weekend of 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup>, from 11h to 18h, you can visit Les Durbellières in Deux Evailles (53, SE of Mayenne town) where Angela Rowlands has created a garden in 1.5 acres, with roses, shrubs, rockeries, ponds, fruit garden, vegetable patch, etc. More info on this and other gardens at *www.opengardens,eu*
