Special dates / public holidays:

- Fri. 1<sup>st</sup> Toussaint (All Saints' Day) a festival honouring the saints of the Roman Catholic church. It precedes the *Fête des Morts* on the 2nd when people honour the dead and bring flowers, usually chrysanthemums and heather, to the graves of relations.
- Mon. 11<sup>th</sup> *l'Armistice* (Remembrance Day) this is the day when those killed in both WWI and WW2 are remembered. Services take place across France, one of the most well known being the Memorial Ceremony at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier in Paris.

#### Eating out : 'La Rabine'

I recommended this restaurant in August 2017 and it is still very good! They have added an extra restaurant area on the side, as they are so popular! It is near St Pierre des Landes (53, on the RN12 between Ernée and Fougères). There is seating for 40 in the original restaurant, plus at least another 40. An excellent selection of dishes – plus an amazing choice from 8 different vegetable dishes! Open Mon. to Fri. 11h30-15h & 19h15-22h (some themed weekends also). Plenty of parking space alongside. Highly recommended!

#### Le Parc Botanique de Haut Bretagne

These privately owned 25 ha gardens are open to the public each year from April until  $15^{\text{th}}$ November. Sited 10km north of Fougeres (35) at Le Chatellier, there are 24 themed gardens – and at this time of year there are also the wonderful colours of the trees around the ponds, lakes and in the woodland. #### Foire de Noêl in St. Martin des Landelles (50)

This festive day for all the family is on Sun. 3<sup>rd</sup>, 10h to 17h in the Salle Polyvalente in St Martin des Landelles (SW of St Hilaire-du-Harcouët) organised by *l'Assoc. AFACTP* [*Amité Franco-Anglaise au Carrefour des Trois Provinces* - which has been going for approx. 20 years to bring together like-minded people wishing to meet others in their area when struggling to integrate]. There will be jewellery, hand-made items, local businesses, a choir, activities for children and tombola. There will be tea & coffee as well as light lunches (incl. Fish & Chips), bacon rolls, soup, etc., as well as a *buvette*. There may also be a cake stall selling cakes and biscuits to take away subject to donations. Free entry. #### Change of ownership in Gorron (53)

As many of you will know, Ingrid Dessein - who for many years ran '*Bout'Chou* selling wool, patterns and haberdashery - closed the shop earlier in the year due to health reasons. On 5th November the shop will re-open, as '*La Maison des Beaux Cadeaux'* is moving into the premises. As well as a wide range of handmade gifts and cards (new stock as well as the regular favourites) there will also be wool, patterns and haberdashery. New services available include clothes repairs & alterations and sewing machine repairs/servicing. On a Tuesday and Thursday, popular sports therapist Val Hanratty will also be based in the shop. A warm welcome awaits new and old customers.

## 60<sup>th</sup> Art Exhibition in Ernée (53)

From 9<sup>th</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup>, at the Espace Clair de Lune, route des Mirettes in Ernée, the 60ème Exposition Régionale d'Art d'Ernée is open at 14h to 18h - but on Sundays 10<sup>th</sup> & 17<sup>th</sup> from 10h to 12h & 14h30 to 17h. Free entry.

#### Foire Saint-Martin in Saint-Hilaire-du-Harcouët (50)

This annual 3-day *foire* takes place on 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> around the town, with around 800 stalls, also agricultural machinery, farming competitions and *fête foraine* (fun fair). This attracts over 150,000 visitors each year. More info at *www.st-hilaire.fr* 

#### Lions Club of Domfront - les roses de la solidarité

Traditionally in mid-November you will see members of *le Lion's Club* selling roses outside many supermarkets, commercial centres and church forecourts. They support local area events (local associations, handicapped people, families in distress, the Alzheimers Welcome Centre) as well as regional, national and international causes (including *Handi-chiens*, which trains and provides assistance dogs for handicapped people). They also organise various events – social evenings, tourist outings, flea markets, collections, exhibitions, etc.

#### Coarse Fish for sale

The *Etang de Launay*, which is situated just before the village of Chatillon-sur-Colmont on the D5 when travelling from Gorron towards Mayenne, is being drained and restocked. As a result the fishery owner, Jack Petithomme, has a range of coarse fish for sale. These include carp up to 10kg, tench, pike, zander and roach. Anyone interested should attend the sale at the lake which takes place on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup>.

#### Telephone numbers

I have been asked to repeat, for people who have newly arrived in France, the following advice: when giving out a phone number, the figures are divided into blocks of 2 (for example: 02 43 60 17 77) and it is very important to pause between the numbers to avoid ambiguity. Without the pause, 60 followed by 17 could be understood to be *soixante-dix-sept*, which is 77. So, when dictating the number 02 54 60 17 77 you would say: *zero deux* [pause] *cinquante-quatre* [pause] *soixante* [pause] *dix-sept* [pause] *soixante-dix-sept*.

#### The law against noise

[Advice for the benefit of both users and neighbours]: During gardening and building works by home-owners and businesses, the use of many tools and equipment can be the cause of unacceptable noise. Equipment such as mowers, grinders, sanders, chainsaws, perceuses, mechanical saws, etc) can only be used during working hours on weekdays: 8h to 12h & 14h to 19h; Saturdays: 9h to 12h & 15h-19h30; Sundays & fête days: 9h to 12h. If someone nearby is causing a disturbance you can inform the *Mairie*.

## French people whose names are immortalised in history . . . and language

Have you ever wondered about the origins of some of the more unusual words in the French language? Many are derived from the surnames of actual French people who made them famous. Over the next few months I will be exploring the names Jacquard, Nicotine, Silhouette, Béchamel, Pralines and Pasteurisation. This month:- Jacquard.

Jacquard print refers to an elaborate diamond pattern woven into fabric that was originally produced on a Jacquard loom – the earliest programmable loom, which wove patterned silk automatically. Joseph Marie Jacquard, the loom's inventor, lived from 1752 to 1834 in Lyon. The Jacquard loom's operational system of using punched cards inspired the development of English engineer Charles Babbage's digital programmable computer in the 19<sup>th</sup> century.

#### Switching on the Christmas Lights in Laval (53)

On Sat. 30<sup>th</sup> (time not specified) by the river, near Pont Aristide Briand, Place de la Trémoille: the official switching-on of the amazing Christmas lights of Laval, followed by fireworks. Not to forget a visit from Father Christmas!

Something you didn't know you didn't know . . .

Saint-Fraimbault (61), the celebrated 'ville fleuri', wasn't always a small village. In 1836 it was quite a large town with 3,056 inhabitants, but by 1911 the number had dropped to 1,935 and to just 601 in 2010. This was due mainly to families leaving rural areas as certain local traders were no longer so needed: *casseur de pierre* (stone-breaker), *cerclier* (cooper), *chaisier* (chair-maker), *taupier* (mole-catcher), *scieur de long* (wood-stripper) or *cordier* (ropemaker). However, many skills were still necessary: *bourrelier* (saddler/harness maker), *couturière* (dressmaker/seamstress), *sabotier* (shoe-maker) and *cantonnier* (road surveyor/ repairer.

#### Beware of a 'lost pet' scam

Pet owners in France are being warned against a new scam that asks owners of lost pets to pay a 'ransom to reclaim' their beloved animal, only to find that their pet is still lost. Scammers have been reported as contacting people who have lost a pet cat or dog, through the details on the owner's 'lost pet' poster or social media post. The scammers then say that they have found the animal and offer the pet's ID number as 'proof', having most likely found the number online or via social networks. They then ask the pet owner to pay money to cover vet bills that they claim to have been paid for the pet, or simply as a 'fee' to cover the costs of caring for the animal and/or giving it back. In reality, the scammers do not have the pet.
