Exhibition 'Merveilleux' in Pontmain (53)

From 10th Oct. to 28th Nov., this exhibition is in the *Centre d'Art Contemporain*. 8 bis rue de la Grange. Something you didn't know you didn't know . . .

The first known photograph was taken in Saint-Loup-de-Varennes in Saône-et-Loire by Joseph Nicéphore Niépce in 1826 or 1827. The Burgundy-born-and-bred Niépce used a *camera obscura* focused on to a thin pewter plat that was coated with light-sensitive bitumen of Judea to take the grainy image of his home.

Temporary boutiques in Gorron (53)

In an attempt to revitalise empty buildings in Gorron, the *mairie* has launched a new idea. The old nurses station, at 18 rue Magenta in Gorron (opposite Gorron Immobilier), will be back in temporary use for a period of 6 months. Cindy Caverne will open *Caverne du Cindy*, with children's clothes, especially the Mickey brand which is very popular. (sorry, not sure of her days in the shop). Her cousin, Michaël Méline, will be selling old-fashioned sweets on Weds. & Sunday mornings and on the 1st and 3rd Friday of the month. Other empty shops may be similarly used in the future.

Dinard Festival du Film Britannique (Festival of British Film)

Butterflies in France

France has an astonishing 260 species of butterfly, not to mention a host of other fascinating insects, if you stop and look. Most butterflies live in the warmer south, roughly below a line drawn from Bordeaux to the Alps, and fly in early summer. You can see some great species just by standing still in a garden or roadside: some common ones are stunning (such as the swallowtail, now not so scarce) or fascinating to watch (the bee hawk-moth, which behaves like a humming-bird).

To see butterflies in profusion and learn about their lifestyles, go on a trip led by an expert guide. Greenwings (*greenwings.co*) runs such trips to the Pyrenees, the Vercors or the Alps. For more info: *butterfly-conservation.org*

What items must you carry with you in your car?

When driving in France you must carry your driving licence, the car's registration document (commonly called a *carte grise*) and the car's insurance documents. You must have a safety jacket (*gilet de sécurité voiture*) inside the car and easily accessible, and a warning triangle (*triangle de présignalisation*) which can be in the boot. Without these you can be fined $135 \in$. If you are stopped without your licence you could be fined up to $38 \in$. In this case you would be given 5 days to produce the licence at a local police station. Failure to do so could mean a $750 \in$ fine.
