'Vivace' Christmas Concerts

Christmas concerts with the Vivace Chorale will be held at the following locations:

King Scallops – Jewel of Saint-Brieuc Bay (35)

In Brittany, the scallop season runs from October to mid-May. Every year, over 6,500 tonnes are fished from Saint Brieuc Bay. Getting up early in the morning in Saint-Quai-Portrieux is rewarded by an authentic ballet of trawlers returning to Port d'Armor. Brightly coloured boats, the comings & goings of fisherman in yellow waterproofs, the swell of the sea, the seagulls flying around. On 14th & 15th April 2023, the port of Erguy will celebrate king scallops in a major 2-day festival. Save the date!

Cheese of the Month: Fourme d'Ambert

Legend says that *Fourme d'Ambert* was already being made at the time of the Druids and the Gauls. It is certainly one of the oldest cheeses in France, along with *Roquefort*. *Fourme d'Ambert* is made in the *Monts de Forez* of Auvergne. '*Fourme*' is an old French word for cheese from the Latin name '*forma*' and describes its cylindrical shape. It is made with cow's milk – 25 litres for one cheese. *Penicillium glaucum* bacteria are added to the cheese which then rests in a cave for at least 2 months. One of the mildest blue cheeses, it is creamy with a delicate, fruity flavour and mushroom overtones. Good in soufflés and salads, and the ideal wine to go with it would be a medium-bodied red from the Côtes de Rhône.

The delicious facts & figures of chocolate

Chocolate is said to have been introduced to France in 1615 when Anne of Austria (daughter of Louis Philippe II of Spain) married Louis XIII and employed her very own *chocolatier* to mix her morning hot chocolate.

In 2020, 354,935 tonnes of chocolate were sold at a total price of $\[\in \]$ 3,329 million, an increase of 2.3% compared with 2019 (180,000 tonnes of which professionals used in bars, restaurants & boulangeries). Chocolate bars accounted for 38% and chocolate spreads 24.5% of the market. The French spend $\[\in \]$ 665 million on Christmas chocolates and $\[\in \]$ 205 million at Easter. Around a third of consumption was dark chocolate (compared with an average of 5% in the rest of Europe). Of chocolate products made in France, 62.1% were exported, most of it to the EU. Between them, France's 115 chocolate companies employ around 30,000 people.

And finally,
