Market in Dol-de-Bretagne (35)

On each Saturday, from 8h30 to 13h, this weekly market has around 100 stalls. Look for local signs for its location (possibly along the main street).

Also in Dol-de-Bretagne:

Every Tuesday, all year, from 16h to 20h is a friendly and atmospheric organic (bio) market in Les Halles, Place Châteaubriand – under the magnificent *Halles* (covered market) which was built in 1879. The market offers you the chance to meet artisans and discover local producers and their organic products.

Eating out - LA TTABLEE

'La Ttablée de la Charentonne' (and no, it's the right spelling!) at 406 rue de Rennes (on the N12 near Mayenne, with a cow outside! - almost opposite the builders merchants) is a restaurant and a food shop, with the sign 'Les Eleveurs' above the entrance. There are 2 meal options, with free coffee: a formule: with buffet entrée, suggestion du jour & dessert for 13,50€; or you can have the buffet entrée and choose your meat and/or vegetables from the shop attached and cook it yourself on the grill provided, for 8€ plus the cost of your choice of the meat and/or vegetables. A unique experience!

Soirée Carnaval in Colombières-du Plessis (53)

On Fri. 21^{st} from 19h30 at the bar restaurant ' \hat{O} Village' at 3 route de Gorron: go and celebrate Carnival in costume and sequins, organised by the \hat{O} Village bar restaurant. Dress up in your craziest costume and celebrate with family and friends – and take part in the election of the King and Queen of Carnival. Food available on site. Bank holidays in France in 2025

It's a good year for *jours fériés* (fête days) in France, with almost all falling on weekdays, meaning that French workers will enjoy a day off work. Even better, 4 of the *jours fériés* fall on a Thursday this year, providing the opportunity to 'faire le pont' (lit. 'make the bridge') by including the Friday and enjoying a 4-day weekend!

Meeting points at the Refuge de l'Arche

On Mon. 10th to Fri. 14th, 14h30 to 15h30, you can meet up at the *Refuge de l'Arche* animal sanctuary, 13 rue Félix Marchand in Château-Gontier (53) during the winter holidays, learning about different animals and birds each day. Raising awareness among visitors, young and old, about the fate of animals held in captivity is the primary objective of the *Refuge de l'Arche*. French postage increases

Postage prices increased in France by almost 7% from January 1st. In practice this means a standard letter will now cost \in 1,39 (10c more than in 2024) while an international letter will cost \in 2,10, up from the 2024 price of \in 1,96.

Something you didn't know you didn't know . . .

When in 2009 Nicholas Sarkozy bestowed the title of knight of the *Ordre National de la Legion d'Honneur* to 'Harry Potter' writer J K Rowling, he was rewarding the second member of her family. Her French great-grandfather received it in 1924 for his courage in the Battle of Verdun.

Guided tour of an artisanale chocolaterie

On Sat. 8th & Thurs. 13th, 15h to 16h15, there is a guided tour (in French) of the BIM Artisanal Chocolate Factory where you can discover their daily life through a gourmet tour. This chocolate factory transforms the fair trade and organic cocoa bean into a chocolate with unique aromatic notes. During the visit, Charline will present (with tasting) the different stages of the production – quality control of the beans, roasting, crushing, winnowing, grinding and tempering. A minimum of 6 visitors are required for this tour to happen. Tickets: 8€, children 4 to 10 yrs: 5€, under 4s free. What is a 'ville fleuri' and how does a town get this label?

Created in 1959, the 'Villes et Villages Fleuris' label is designed to encourage towns and villages to dedicate more public space to vegetation. A commune can be awarded anywhere between one and four flower symbols. The first 3 are attributed by the region, while the fourth is decided by a national council. By last year, 4,626 communes have the label, while 277 have the four flowers.

The 60 or so criteria also include actions taken to preserve biodiversity, related promotion and activities aimed at residents and tourists, and other actions to improve the quality of public spaces, whether street furniture or cleanliness. Each year 2,000 judges travel the country evaluating and giving advice to participants. Towns must pay between 5€ and 1,500€ to participate, depending on their size.

Advance notice - Bee Festival in Gorron (53) in May

The town of Gorron is aiming for a third 'Api-cité' award for its dedication to bees and beekeeping. It has already attained 2 'Api-cité' labels – these are awarded to towns that are actively protecting bees, producing honey and promoting api-culture (the science of beekeeping). In 2024, with one communal ruche (beehive) 25k of honey was produced, thanks also to the biodiversity around the Parc de la Colmont with its prairie fleurie and eco-pâturage. The aim is to add a second ruche in Spring this year.

Members of the *EPI du Bocage* are organising a *fête de l'abeille* (bee festival) in May in Gorron and are requesting for people to save their large tins or jars of preserve (850ml or medium size) and metal bottle caps and to take them at any time from now on to the *Mairie*. These may be turned into the large bees that will decorate the town! The *Mairie* is open Mondays to Fridays 8h30 to 12h15 & 13h30 to 17h30, but is closed on Thursday mornings and at 17h on Fridays.
